- Risk reduction – for ASL and for our clients
- Legal compliance

- Lead our sector in best practice and continual improvement of the ASL ISMS

Information security objectives will be decided upon, reviewed, and monitored for progress by ASL senior management, and will be disseminated throughout the organisation as appropriate. It is the responsibility of all staff to work towards the objectives of the organisation, and to uphold ASL's values and commitments when carrying out their work and relevant business operations.

Awareness and Review

This policy will be made available to all staff and interested parties, and the review of this policy will be part of the onboarding process for new staff. This policy will be reviewed during annual management reviews but will also be reviewed to ensure relevance and effectiveness in the case of changes to organisational structure or business demands that would impact this policy. This review should focus on the effectiveness of this policy, relevance to business processes and compliance to ASL's statutory, regulatory, and contractual obligations.
